HEC grades VU Quality Directorate in "W" Category

The Virtual University (VU) of Pakistan was chartered by the Federal Government of Pakistan in 2002. VU was established as first university of distant learning based on modern Information and Communication Technologies. VU is using all modern IT platforms to deliver its courseware to the students. VU courseware has also got global recognition as the "Best Open Courseware". The VU is resolutely working to provide less expensive education of uniform quality through its 210 VU Campuses spread throughout Pakistan. With increasing enrollment the bigger challenge is the quality of its delivered educational contents. Distinct than most universities for quality metrics, Board of Governors (BoG) of VU, at the place of Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) approved establishment of Directorate of Quality Enhancement (DQE). Based on the latest assessment by the Quality Assurance Agency (QAA) of Higher Education Commission (HEC), VU has

been rated in the highest "W" category, obtaining total score of 91% for the period ending December, 2012. The 'W' category is the top-most slot in QEC rating criteria. This landmark achievement is the result of vigorous and persistent efforts of DQE and academic and other staff members of the university. Rector of the University lauded their efforts with the hope that similar achievements should become norm for future.

"The Physics of Donkey Carts": Dr Naveed A Malik's Lecture got International Recognition


Leaders of online institutions gathered at Massachusetts Institute of Technology this week at annual meeting of the Learning International Networks Consortium.

Virtual universities in many countries have been using technology to teach thousands of students at a time. Even so, leaders of those online institutions, who gathered here this week at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, said they were watching massive open online courses closely.



One key takeaway from the event, though, was that virtual universities in other countries have no plans to add lectures from famous professors at Massachusetts Institute of Technology or other American colleges to their own online institutions.

Bakary Diallo, Rector of African Virtual University stated "Transferring education from the United States to Africa wouldn't work because we have our own realities," he added, "our own context and culture." Naveed A. Malik, founding rector of the Virtual University of Pakistan, echoed that



sentiment. "This is something that we learned very early in our virtualuniversity experience," he said. "We couldn't pick up a course from outside and then transplant it into a Pakistani landscape—the context was completely different." Both universities have been teaching courses to students on a large scale for more than a decade. An introductory computer-science course at the Virtual University of Pakistan typically has about 12,000 students, Mr. Malik said. And both universities say they will continue to build their own course materials. One example is a video lecture, taught by Mr. Malik himself, called "The Physics of Donkey Carts."

"Look, it is physics—it is Newton's laws—but let me show you something that you have seen in your own real-world experience," said Mr. Malik, as he described the video.

The two leaders spoke on a panel this week as part of the annual meeting of the Learning International Networks Consortium, an MIT-managed project devoted to the spread of online learning.

Topographic survey will be used for planning construction of the campus. Term of Reference for

hiring of a consultant for designing the master plan of the campus will be prepared and presented for the approval in the next meeting. Committee also agreed to follow HEC for guidelines for the establishment of the campus. A subcommittee was also formed to prepare preliminary part of PC-1 for the construction of faculty buildings and budget estimates will be provided by the Finance Department. Next meeting will be held by the end of July
